

The National Shared Services Office (NSSO) is an administrative office within the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform, set up as part of the Government's reform programme.

The National Shared Services Office is led by the Chief Executive, who reports to the Secretary General of the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform and it currently consists of:

- two operational shared service centres:
 - **PeoplePoint** (HR & Pensions Administration Shared Service Centre)
PeoplePoint began providing HR and pensions administration shared services to the Civil Service on a phased basis in March 2013 and is continuing to roll this out to other Public Service Bodies in scope throughout 2015.

 - the **Payroll Shared Service Centre** (PSSC)
- three projects: the PeoplePoint project, the Payroll Shared Services Centre project and the Financial Management Shared Service Centre project. Each project remains active until all components of it have gone into operation.
- the Corporate Services Division, providing corporate governance and compliance functions, such as risk management, financial management, business planning, audit, learning and development, customer support and stakeholder engagement)
- the Policy & Advisory Division which includes setting standards, research and policy development, as well as providing guidance and advice to shared services sectors across the Public Service.

The National Shared Services Office has offices in eight locations:

- PeoplePoint is in Clonskeagh, Dublin, as is the PeoplePoint Project Team
- The Corporate & Business Services functions are in 7-9 Merrion Row, Dublin
- The Payroll Shared Service Centre is located in Galway, Killarney and Tullamore, and the PSSC project team is in Killarney, Tullamore and Ennis.
- The Financial Management Shared Service project team is in Smithfield, Dublin; Killarney and Tullamore.
